Roundtable on The Environment: Transportation Management Plan For The CRD.

BACKGROUND:


In October 1992, The CRD Healthy Atmosphere 2000 Project, in a report to the CRD Board, outlined a series of measures to reduce greenhouse gas emissions. A number of these measures were transportation related and there was an indicated need for integrated transportation and regional planning.

In response to this report, the Go Green Victoria Network was established and in 1995, the CRD became a community member as recommended by the Environment Committee. Furthermore, a CRD Go Green Committee was formed in 1995 and has been actively promoting transportation alternatives to CRD staff. In addition, the Regional Growth Strategy was undertaken by the CRD in 1996 and, as currently proposed, contains requirements for the development of a Regional Transportation Strategy and other strategic elements such as economic development and housing affordability.

In 2000, the Roundtable on the Environment formed a number of working subcommittees to explore solutions to environmental concerns within the CRD. In keeping with its mandate, the Greenhouse Gas Emissions Subcommittee identified an opportunity to facilitate the creation and implementation of a CRD Employee Transportation Management Program (ETMP). The Roundtable submitted a proposal to the Greening Communities Initiative - Ministry of Community Development, Co-operatives and Volunteers- for funding in the amount of \$22,600, which was subsequently approved.

DISCUSSION:

The objective of the proposed EMTP is to improve travel choices and to reduce the total number of motor vehicle trips generated by CRD employees, thereby reducing greenhouse gas emissions.
