TENANTS' INSURANCE

Please check your tenants' insurance is up to date.

We recently had a serious incident at one of our buildings and, because the sprinklers deployed, 19 homes were affected. When this happens CRHC do not relocate people to other units if they are required to leave for repairs. Your tenants' insurance is the easiest way to make sure you can pay for a few nights somewhere else. Make sure you understand the excess, and please try to save for the additional expenses. VEHICLE INSURANCE

On the subject of insurance, you also need to be fully insured if you have a vehicle parking space through CRHC. Storage insurance is not sufficient and your vehicle must be insured, functional and safely operated at all times.

This is a material term of your tenancy agreement and you need to make sure to have full vehicle insurance at all times.

ISOLATION AND SUPPORTS

Isolation is particularly difficult at this time of year. Loneliness has health implications similar to smoking 15 cigarettes a day. We know that during covid and the heat dome, isolation compounded for seniors.

What can we do? If you are isolated, reach out. Activities like volunteering, courses at your local rec centre, using seniors serving organizations like Silver Threads, a social routine (like always going to the same park, cafe or social program at the same time), exercise can all help. These activities are shown to protect against the health risks of isolation.

If you know there are isolated people in your building, connect with Tenant Engagement at CRHC if you'd like to help. Tenants often organize coffee mornings or hobby groups and CRHC can help with funding for these. Most importantly, if there is an emergency, check in with your neighbours. They may need you.
