As the Southern Gulf Islands (SGI) Area Director, I am pleased to express my support for the Rural Islands Economic Partnership (RIEP) Society's application for the Rural Economic Diversification and Infrastructure Program (REDIP) Economic Diversification Development Stream funding. The information collected will serve as the foundation for a Regional State of the Economy Report, equipping these communities with the tools they need for sustained, data-informed economic support.

As the Chair of the Southern Gulf Islands Community Economic Sustainability Commission, I understand that the absence of coordinated local economic data has hindered evidence-based strategies and indicators necessary for effective decision-making. Establishing a system to analyze key economic indicators is vital for fostering resilience and sustainability, allowing our communities to better navigate economic transitions and shocks.

I am enthusiastic about supporting RIEP's Communities Talking Project. It represents a significant step toward improving how our rural islands and remote coastal communities measure their economic well-being. By creating a community-informed economic index model, this project will contribute to building thriving, inclusive, and enduring socio-economic capacity across our communities and throughout rural coastal regions of British Columbia.
